Lichfield Society of Artists Autumn Exhibition

Following our very successful Autumn Exhibition Barabara Weaving our Exhibition Organiser has kindly written a short report.

Autumn Exhibition Friday Oct 20th to Sunday 22nd

Friday the 20th didn't bode well for our three-day Autumn exhibition, most of the day was wet, miserable, and quiet for our stewards. Even our judge David Poxon, unfortunately having to travel from Shropshire, was affected by the atrocious road conditions.

Luckily it didn't last, and the following two days were brighter and happily profitable for our exhibition. With over 90 examples of framed paintings, and more ceramics and sculptures to show, it was well received with a footfall of nearly 1,000 visitors.

We sold 10 paintings, many of Sue Crudginton's ceramics, Dennis Rollason's sculpture "Ripples", and many shop items from the display of goodies.

David Poxon gave an extra personal award for the best watercolour painting, which was won by Ray Blundell, for "Late afternoon, St Marco's Arch." Ray's prize is two tickets to the International Watercolour Exhibition at Lilleshall Hall next May, plus tickets to the Master's banquet on the evening of the 18th.

The Armour Brown award for best in show was awarded to Daniela Sommer-Owsianny for “Still life with apples.”

The Jack Ballinger award for architecture was won by Liz Thomas for “Whitewick Manor.”

The Sybil Clarke award for sculpture and 3D was won by Stuart Burn for “Eric and Ian.”

The Michael Fabricant award for landscape was won by Dennis Harper for “Loch Awe, Scotland.”

Joan Rollason for “Cherries.”

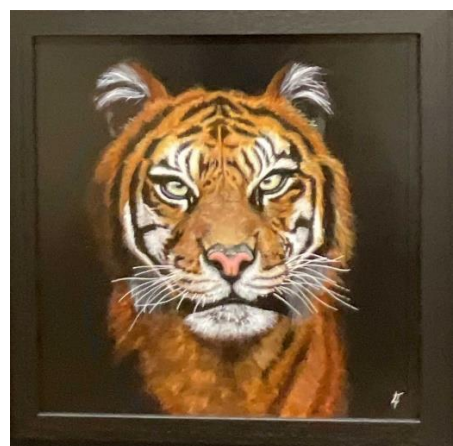
Beryl Evans for “Millie.”
