The theme of the workshop will be Batik inspired by John Piper

"The artist John Piper created atmospheric images of the English landscape and its architecture. Using his work as inspiration students will use the technique of batik – hot wax resist. We will work on tissue paper & found papers with bleach and inks to create atmospheric textures and effects. An exciting course allowing for exploration and discovery. The work will be suitable for further development with stitch. No experience is necessary as the technique will be taught from scratch. A number of samples will be created during the workshop."

Max. 20 places.

The cost is likely to be around £40 for a day's tuition payable in advance to secure a place once arrangements are confirmed. This represents good value for money as the society is only aiming to cover costs.

£3 will be payable on the day directly to Jenny towards the cost of materials.
